WORKSHEET FOR REPORTING & UPDATING ROSE INFORMATION

5/8/2006

This worksheet provides the headings and available entries needed for HMF editors to create and change entries for roses in the HMF database. Not all entries need be provided. Enter what you can. You and others can follow up with additional information.

If you feel your entries are questionable or you don't agree with an existing entry, bring it to everyone's attention on the HRF Forum or so note in the notes section or in Questions & Comments (**Q&C**). When you do so, indicate your USDA (or comparable) zone and any special local climate issues that may affect your entries.

If you take all or part of your information from a book, catalog or other reference, please indicate the source, author, date and page number. This will be placed under the **References** tab.

Major Headings are bold and in caps. Sub headings are bold.

To use, make a copy of this file and select the entries to be posted by identifying them by placing parenthesis around them. EG. (Alba). As an alternative, make a separate file with the desired entries copied from this file. If you need to qualify your choices from lists of characteristics, do so in "**NOTES.**" If the qualifier is extensive, place a pointer in "**NOTES.**" And enter the qualifier in "**Q&C.**"

Care Selection. Select all that apply:

- **Requires winter protection** if temperatures drop below freezing
- **Spring Pruning:** Remove old canes and dead or diseased wood and cut back canes that cross. In warmer climates, cut back the remaining canes by about one-third. In colder areas, you'll probably find you'll have to prune a little more than that
- Can be grown as a climber in mild climates
- Can be grown in the ground or in a container (container requires winter protection)
- Can be pruned to maintain a shorter habit
- Cut back one-half every other year

- Do not dead head
- Do not prune
- Do not spray
- Feed this rose well
- Needs little care -- it's relatively disease-free and quite hardy
- Prune dead wood
- Prune lightly or not at all
- Prune lightly until this rose gets established (about two years), then prune it back by about a third.
- Prune right after flowering is finished
- Remove old canes and dead or diseased wood.
- Remove spent blooms only
- Remove spent blooms to encourage re-bloom
- Remove unproductive wood every third year or so
- Requires good cultivation if it is to perform its best
- Resist the urge to prune this rose too heavily -- it doesn't like it!
- This rose blooms on old wood

There is an "Admin" area available to those with editing privileges that is not displayed to the public. This is an ideal location to record the exact location of a found rose to assist in future resolution of multiple study names.
